Too many young people drink underage, leading to difficulty in school and increased risk of addiction.

Early social access to alcohol from adults



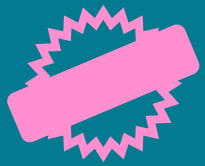
96% of alcohol vendors refused to sell to minors

LCMHA and Communities in Schools partnered with local youth and the Lenawee County Sheriff's Office to complete 188 compliance checks.



100% of alcohol vendors received education

Communities in Schools' Prevention Coordinator completed education with all alcohol vendors in Lenawee County.



74 alcohol servers were certified to prevent risky and underage drinking

The Lenawee County Health Department provided 11 Trainings for Intervention Procedures (TIPS) to alcohol servers.



69% of community members surveyed became more aware of the legal risk of giving alcohol to minors

Communities in Schools' Prevention Coordinator surveyed 97 community members at local events.



52 community members pledged to Do Their Part to prevent underage drinking

Communities in Schools' Prevention Coordinator collected pledges at local events.



4345 community members received prevention information from the LSAPC website and social media

COMMUNITY TRIALS INTERVENTION & DO YOUR PART

Community Trials Intervention and Do Your Part are strategies that seek to reduce underage drinking through information dissemination, education, environmental changes, and community-based processes. They intend to impact all youth, regardless of risk. These programs were first introduced in Lenawee County in 2014.
